



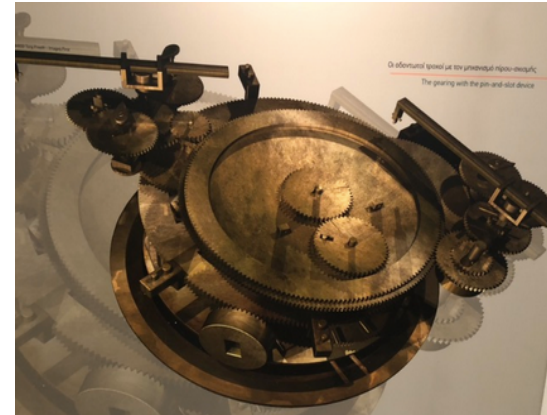

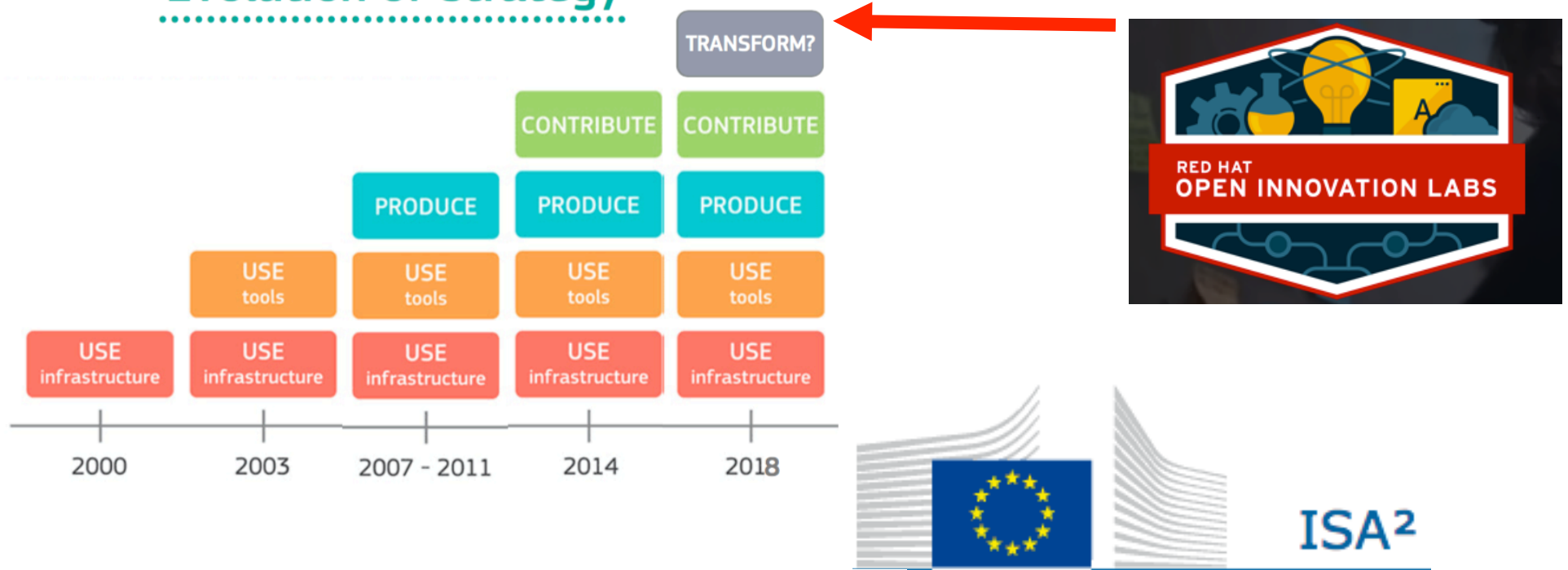

Digital Strategy for future-proof Commission adopted

21/11/2018

On the 21st of November, the College adopted the Digital Strategy of the European Commission. It sets a vision for the Commission to become a digitally transformed, user-focused and data-driven administration by 2022.



- October 2018: EU's Digital Strategy
- March 2018: ISA 2 launched
- October 2017: EU's Digital Government Declaration (Tallinn)
- March 2017: European Interoperability Framework
- April 2016: ICT standardisation priorities
- April 2016: ISA launched
- May 2015: EU's digital single market (replacing 2010 Digital Agenda)
- June 2013: Communication 455 "Against lock-in: building open ICT"
- October 2012: Regulation 1025 re. Standardisation referenced in Procurement
- May 2010: EU Digital Agenda - driven much more by tech neutrality and specific action items, e.g. action 23 on ICT standardisation & Procurement
- March 2004: EU's Public Procurement Directive equal access of economic operators
- July 2003: EU's OSS strategy updated to recommend LINUX as Operating System
- December 2000: EU's first OSS strategy re. Internal use of Open Source
