

 October 2017: EU's Digital Government Declaration (Tallinn)

March 2017: European Interoperability Framework

April 2016: ICT standardisation priorities

April 2016: ISA launched

• May 2015: EU's digital single market (replacing 2010 Digital Agenda)

June 2013: Communication 455 "Against lock-in: building open ICT"

October 2012: Regulation 1025 re. Standardisation referenced in Procurement

 May 2010: EU Digital Agenda - driven much more by tech neutrality and specific action items, e.g. action 23 on ICT standardisation & Procurement

March 2004: EU's Public Procurement Directive equal access of economic operators

July 2003: EU's OSS strategy updated to recommend LINUX as Operating System
